Undergraduate Student Spotlight:

Maya Morris (junior) spent the past summer as a TRIO McNair Scholar at UofSC. Under the mentorship of Dr. Jason Cummings, Maya learned quantitative content analysis to analyze viral videos of African-Americans being profiled and harassed by civilian Whites. She found that 80% of the civilian perpetrators of racial harassment of African-Americans were White women, and that these women called the police 75% of the time, even when there was no evidence of wrongdoing. Maya reported her findings in her paper: "Guardians of White Supremacy: White Women and the Policing of White Public Places," for which she was awarded the McNair program's Extra Mile Award. Maya was also recently awarded the Grace Jordan McFadden Award by the African American Studies Program. Asked about her experience as a McNair Scholar, Maya said:



"The McNair Program was an amazing experience that I feel has helped prepare me for success in my post graduate endeavors. Under Dr. Cummings' brilliant leadership, I was able to complete and present my own research."

Graduate Student Spotlight:

Nik Lampe's study, "Continuity and Change in Gender Frames: The Case of Transgender Reproduction." was recently published in *Gender and Society*. In the study, Lampe and colleagues analyze recently published news articles on transgender people's reproductive experiences. They find that while media outlets increasingly recognize the experiences of transgender people, they also maintain cisnormative and repronormative traditions and beliefs through a variety of processes.
